SUPPLIES NEEDED

- Glue Gun
- Adhesive & Glue Dots
- Acrylic Paint
- Acrylic Circle (6")
- Chipboard Circle (5")
- Chipboard & Letter
- Scissors & Trimmer
- Foam Adhesive
- Ribbon

TO MAKE MONOGRAM HANGER:

STEP ONE

Gather the Artisan tape until there are enough folds to form a circle.

STEP TWO

Begin by trimming a piece of chipboard to 6" wide and 9 tall" My door hanger is 9 inches high including the scallop edge. Use a piece of scalloped paper, chipboard or decorative ruler to help you create a scallop bottom.

STEP THREE

Cover the chipboard base with 1 1/2 x 1 1/2 patterned paper blocks. Ink the edges of all of the paper blocks with black chalk ink for added interest and cover the chipboard base with blocks – leaving the scallop bottom uncovered.

STEP FOUR

Cover the scallop bottom of the chipboard base with yellow dot paper (honeybee).

STEP FOUR

Create an embellished ribbon strip by layering various ribbons over the grey pleated ribbon

leaving the edges of the pleated ribbon exposed. Glue the embellished ribbon pleat over the seam between the scallop edge and the top portion. Then tuck in a strip of lace and glue it down under the pleated ribbon.

STEP FIVE

Paint your chipboard letter/monogram with acrylic paint in a coordinating color (I used a Ranger paint applicator in Willow.) After the letter dries thoroughly, carefully apply the press on over the top of the letter. When you pull the rub on backing away from the letter after application, there will be 'rough' edges left around the letters edge. With your finger, smooth the edges of the rub on around the edges of the letter.

HOW TO CREATE THE RIBBON CORSAGE FLOWER:

Use a hot glue gun (or fabri-tac) for this process.

STEP ONE

Cut a 4" piece of grey pleated ribbon and reserve the entire strip of the gold pleat. Begin with the grey pleat first and apply a line of glue under the center stitch of the grey pleat. Roll the pleat into a 'tube'. Now apply glue to the bottom (under the center stitch) of the entire gold pleat. Continue to roll this pleat around the grey pleat. While the glue is still warm, mold the flower with your hands, slightly pressing the outside edges of the flower down

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to create a realistic flower.

STEP TWO

Snip the metal clasps off of the gemstone brad. Squeeze an ample amount of hot glue into the center of your pleated flower and set the gem brad into the center of the flower.

STEP THREE

Adding glue under the flower, I attached a few loops of sheer ribbon to peek under the left hand side of the flower.

STEP FOUR

Cover a 5" chipboard circle with the Worker Bee patterned paper.

STEP FIVE

Attach the chipboard circle over the center of the acrylic circle with foam tape for elevation. Attach the circle components to the

center of the door hanger base above the pleated ribbon, again use foam tape for elevation.

STEP SIX

Cut out a pair of leaves from the Honeybee patterned paper sheet.

STEP SEVEN

Assemble the leaves, corsage flower, stamp shaped Punchout, and monogram to the front of the chipboard circle as desired.

STEP EIGHT

Punch 2 holes in the top of the chipboard base and run ribbon through the holes; tie in a bow on the front of the project.

STEP NINE

Pucker the tails of the ribbon as desired and tack to the project with glue dots as desired.
